

Learn about choosing and using kitchen wall tiles.

Ceramic kitchen wall tiles are a great choice for both stylish appeal and functionality. . Ceramic tile is perfect to put on top of countertops, on walls and around and behind sinks to guard them from water and moisture. Another favorite use of tile in the kitchen is to create lovely accent walls too.

Not only are *kitchen wall tiles* useful for keeping water away but also they are easy to clean and are a great way to add style to your drab kitchen and other areas.

Ceramic tiles that are popular on countertops and walls are typically glazed. Ceramic tiles aren't the only type of tiles you can use. There are porcelain and stone along with ceramic. Make sure you know the differences specific to each type before you make a final choice of kitchen wall tiles.

The first thing you must do to add *kitchen wall tiles* to an area is to measure the wall to determine the amount of tile you'll need. Also, choose the best size tile to fit your wall. If you're doing a special tile design you may have various tile sizes to use. You can use different colored kitchen wall tiles in different patterns to create a certain design on the wall. Alternatively, you can strategically insert a different color tile throughout your walls. When using kitchen wall tiles you're really only limited by your imagination for styles and designs. There are many ways to decorate your walls with tile.

Kitchen Wall Tiles

Ceramic kitchen wall tiles are held together by grout, which is also available in your color choice. The grout is a paste that is spread on the wall and between each tile and then the excess is wiped away. Once it's dry, it hardens to hold each one together. This is one of the most important steps when adding kitchen wall tiles.

Another important step is the choice of backing for your *kitchen wall tiles*. You'll want to use what's called 'backer board.' This helps to seal your wall structure from damage as well as help the tiles stick better and longer. The special backer board should have a thin fiberglass mesh.

If something happens to one or two of your tiles, such as certain kitchen wall tiles become chipped or cracked, they have to be replaced. A simple repair is not an option, the only solution is replacement. Make a note that water and moisture behind the tiles can cause problems later too.
